- Wetlands management



Certified Prescribed Burn Process

- > Prescription
 - Site description
 - Required resources
 - Weather parameters
 - Desired effects
 - Safety
 - Smoke management
- > Publicity & coordination
- > Fire line preparation
- > Secure Forestry authorization
- > Setting black line
- > Ignition pattern
- > Mop-up







SFWMD Burn Equipment

- > Protective gear
- > Radios
- > Drip torches
- > Flame throwers
- > Fire tools
- > Pumper trucks
- > Brush trucks
- > Swamp Buggies
- > Airboats
- > Tractor/disk for firebreaks
- > Front-end loaders for felling dead trees
- > ATV's/Argos/side by sides with water and fire

- > 18 State Certified Burners in Land Stewardship
- > Another two certified in other Sections
- > Responsible for wildlands fire throughout District
- > 15,000 acres, 55 prescribed burns annually
- > 4-10 crew members/prescribed burn
- > When conditions are right, we all burn
- Get assistance from other sections, field stations, state & federal governments, non-profit organizations, contractors, and volunteers










Prescribed Fire on Lake Okeechobee






