







- Water from our homes & businesses that is treated by your local utility and used again

 - Groundwater recharge
 - Environmental enhancement



DISTRICTWIDE POPULATION GROWTH AND DEMANDS










RECLAIMED WATER & IRRIGATION



- About two-thirds of reclaimed water produced by utilities in the District is used for irrigation
- Reclaimed water can reduce stress on traditional sources of water used for irrigation
 - It's a challenge for utilities to balance reclaimed water supplies with irrigation demands



REUSE BY REGION

- Close to 100% reused
- Newer development, increased efficiency
- 25%-50% reuse
- Transitional, regionalization
- 4%-8% reuse
- Older, urban, coastal wastewater systems
- Ocean outfall legislation






REUSE HISTORY IN THE SFWMD

2019

- *302 mgd reused
- *~600 mgd disposed
 - Deep well injection
 - Oceandischarge





SFWMD INVESTMENT IN WATER REUSE

Water Reuse Weel May

- > FY97 Present:
 - 274 water reuse projects co-funded
 - 155 mgd of additional reuse capacity
 - \$114 million in approved funding, supporting \$699 million in construction









CAPE CORAL-FORT MYERS RECLAIMED WATER INTERCONNECT




- ➤ Fort Myers to send reclaimed water under the Caloosahatchee River to Cape Coral
- ➤ Allows Fort Myers to reduce or eliminate discharges to the river while providing irrigation water to Cape Coral
- > Reclaimed water flowing by January 2023
- ⇒ \$3M State grant for construction approved
 by Governing Board in Fiscal Year 2020





BROWARD-PALM BEACH COUNTY COOPERATION




- Unmet irrigation demand for reclaimed water in southern Palm Beach County
- Broward County has the reclaimed water to supply the demand
- > Ocean outfall legislation requirement
- ➤ \$3M State grant for pipeline construction approved by Governing Board in Fiscal Year 2020





FLORIDA POTABLE REUSE COMMISSION




- Potable Reuse Commission (PRC) established in February 2018 is a consensus-based body of stakeholders
- 11-member partnership: utilities, environment, agriculture, Department of Health, public health/medical state university, industry
- Water management districts and FDEP are ex-officio members
- Developed a policy and regulatory framework for the implementation of potable reuse as a water supply alternative to meet Florida's future water needs
- Framework completed in January 2020
- FDEP initiated rulemaking on potable reuse in January 2021



Water Reuse – Looking Ahead

- Increasing water reuse = less stress on traditional water sources
- Increasing water reuse = less disposal
- The District and FDEP will continue to promote and encourage water reuse
