Above-Average May Rainfall Signals Start of Rainy Season

South Florida's annual rainy season began in May with 7.11 inches of rain - nearly twice the historical average for the month. The entire 16-county region received above average-rainfall during the month, with the Kissimmee and Caloosahatchee river basins and Martin and St. Lucie counties recording the wettest conditions.

May capped a dry season that was one of the wettest since recordkeeping began in 1932. November 2015 to May 2016 brought 29.49 inches of rain, the highest total for that seven-month period since 1957-1958.
