


Florida Cracker Trail Facts

***Includes part of SR66, SR64 and US 98**

***On November 20, 2000 the Florida Cracker Trail was selected as a Community Millennium Trail.**

***A cross state ride occurs every year-- where historians, equestrians, families, cowboys and kids alike ride 110 miles on horseback the entirety of the Florida Cracker Trail.**
